About the Trust

The Varsity Trust is a unique venture, created by a deed dated 1 July 1992, with the principal object of furthering the education of students in journalism by the provision of funds in the form of scholarships, bursaries or grants to students attending Universities in Cambridge.

Varsity provides a unique learning opportunity for those interested in journalism and photojournalism to experience the elements of the trade in a professionally-run environment, with the same pressures of deadlines, accuracy and quality to be met as at any other publication. The Trust seeks to reward those with a passion for journalism by assisting them with their first steps into the professional world.

If suitable candidates present themselves, the Trustees intend to make an award or awards to a student or students about to graduate or recent graduates from either the University of Cambridge or ARU who intend to undertake approved journalistic training of any sort in 2024/2025, this includes contributing to the cost of full and part-time diploma courses provided by The National Council for the Training of Journalists (NCTJ).

Trust awards are tailored to individual circumstances, but, normally, are intended to make a significant contribution to the tuition fees for the training concerned. Up to £5,000 is potentially available.

How to Apply

Applications are now being accepted for the Varsity Trust Scholarships for the academic year 2024/2025 for those planning to undertake postgraduate training in journalism.

The deadline for receiving applications is midday on 19th April 2024.

To apply, please send as a single PDF file comprising the following:

1. A covering letter.
2. Your CV.
3. The names and contact details of three referees.
4. "Cuttings" demonstrating three examples of your work in student journalism (1 cutting per page - maximum three sheets of 'A4' total).
5. Details of any other potential sources of funding and income for your intended course. In addition, a detailed breakdown of how you propose to meet the remaining the fees and maintenance costs of the course.
6. A personal statement of approximately 250 words on your motives for becoming a journalist.

Eligibility

Students may apply before any firm offer of training has been received, but payment of any award will be conditional on the applicant being successful in receiving an offer from their chosen institution *and* after providing confirming documentation that they have actually taken up that place on an approved course of training in journalism.

The Trustees hope to be in a position to make an election or elections in the early part of Cambridge University Easter term.

Submissions will be discussed by the Trustees and shortlisted candidates will be invited to interview.

While experience of student journalism is a pre-requisite, applicants need have no experience writing for *Varsity* or its associated publications.

Applications will be accepted from members of the University of Cambridge and associated institutions - and Anglia Ruskin University.
